- (1) Held First Reading to amend ordinance to increase monthly garbage fee 47 cents/month (\$14.33 to \$14.80)
- (2) Approved zone change, Residential Estate Restricted to Neighborhood Business, 5155 Road 536
- (3) Set tax levy for calendar year 2019 (fiscal year ending 09/30/20) for city and school district... No increase!
- (4) Tabled the resolution adopting the fiscal year 2019-2020 municipal budget
- (5) Approved self-funded employee group health insurance with Blue Cross Blue Shield of MS
- (6) Approved reappointment of members to the Building and Housing Board of Adjustments and Appeals
- (7) Approved resolution to provide for repair/maintenance & electricity costs at the Seafood Museum

The city is seeking proposals for six structures -- five houses and one office building -- which have been acquired by the city as part of the commercial corridor that is being created between I-110 and the new Keesler gate on Division. The structures are at 956, 960, 991, 1001, 1007 Division St., and 301 Seal Avenue.
