Code Enforcement... *You've received a Notice of Violation, now what?*
The Code Enforcement division of the Community Development department deals with properties when a complaint has been filed. Those complaints include issues such as high/uncut grass, unsecure structures and other possible code/ordinance violations. Generally, once a complaint has been received, Code Enforcement staff investigate to determine if a violation exists. If so, the enforcement process begins with a Notice of Violation. A re-inspection occurs about 10 days later to determine if the issue has been corrected. Additional time may be granted if progress is being made *and* communication with the Code Enforcement officer has been established. If there is no communication with the Code Enforcement and/or no progress has been made, a Citation is issued requiring a Community Court appearance. Court is conducted the second Wednesday of the month at the Community Development building. When you appear, have a plan of action to present to the judge. A Memorandum of Understanding will be established and signed. If you don't appear, there will be a trial without you. If the issue is corrected before the court date, you should call Code Enforcement to verify the correction. Please note that the goal is compliance with city ordinances but if it's not achieved in a timely manner, you can be fined and charged court costs! [For more info...](#)
