

Priority preemption agreement...

See the agreement

Coast Transit Authority (CTA) and the city of Biloxi have a preemption priority agreement to fit equipment in traffic signals along Pass Road. The equipment will turn the traffic signals green in their busses' direction of travel. CTA will also provide the priority equipment for city fire trucks. The project is expected to be bid in June and awarded in July.

Here's where city gaming revenue goes... (Sun Herald, Mary Perez)

Casinos pay a 12 percent tax on winnings before they deduct the cost of wages and other expenses of doing business. Eight percent of the 12 percent tax goes to the state. Up to 4 percent of the tax goes to the municipality where the casino is located. From there it is split in several ways. Biloxi collects 32% of the casino tax on the city's casinos plus a fee for each slot machine, with 40% deposited into the city's general fund, 20% to public safety for police and fire departments, 10 percent to Harrison County public safety, 20% to Biloxi Public Schools, and 10% to the other school districts in Harrison County.
